
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While our Academy is low in some and high in other ethnic areas, we are pleased at the fact that our Academy's demographics closely correlate with the overall demographics of Northside High School. Our Academic Team will continue along with the Advisory Board's guidance to recruit and engage those ethnic groups in which we are most lacking.


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One of the concerns of our Advisory Board was that our Academy was preferentially targeting those students already destined for academic success. To demonstrate that our Academy attracts and accepts a variety of students, as also witnessed from the demographic comparison chart on page 3, the PLAN test scores are displayed above. The PLAN is a preliminary ACT test that is generally administered in the sophomore year. ACT, Inc. claims that it predicts success on the ACT. It is viewed as the ACT's equivalent of the PSAT. The PLAN® Test includes four multiple-choice tests: English, Math, Reading, and Science with scores ranging from 0 to 32. The chart above demonstrates that our current sophomores are a great mixture of intelligence to include academia experience. This will prove beneficial as our students learn to collaborate and learn from and with each other throughout this program.


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While our Academy is low regarding our female population, we are pleased at the fact that our Academy's gender demographics are still better than that of our nation, which is currently 13%.
